Additionally, a \$1.60 per member per capita charge for the Grand Lodge Insurance program will become effective immediately and will be included on the Annual Recapitulation statements to be issued in January 2023. Lodges need to consider the total per capita and assessment charges of \$59.20 as well as the Grand Lodge insurance amount of \$1.60 in their financial review that is to be conducted in June as per Regulation 37.010. Any changes to the amount that a Lodge will charge a member for his membership card shall be considered a change to the Lodge By-Laws and be reported to the Grand Secretary as an amendment to the Lodge By-Laws. Form 44 shall be used for this purpose. *The contribution to the George Washington Masonic National Memorial was increased from \$1.00 to \$2.00 on a motion from Grand Master Richard Lentz. The motion was seconded and approved by majority voice vote.

To keep our heads above water, it is imperative that we all pull together and continue our current fund-raising projects and identify pathways for new fund-raising projects. Consider sharing your ideas at our regularly scheduled Stated Meetings.
