Francisco Franco, Arch-Enemy of the Craft

OVER THE CENTURIES, Freemasonry, sad to say, has had more than its share of enemies. They have included churches, both Catholic and Protestant; leftist politicians, Communists, and dictators such as Adolf Hitler, Benito Mussolini, and Saddam Hussein. Another anti-Masonic fanatic was General Francisco Franco, the ruler of Spain from 1939 to 1975.

Franco led his rebel army to victory in the Spanish Civil War (1936-39) and then imprisoned or executed his political rivals, announced that Catholicism would be the only religion allowed in the country, and restored the monarchy under his strict control. He also forced Masonic lodges to close, destroyed their buildings, and declared membership in the fraternity to be a "crime of rebellion" punishable by death. Historians agree that as many as 10,000 Masons were shot during the Franco era.

What motivated this madness? The basic answer is that no tyrant can tolerate an organization that teaches the love of God and the brotherhood of man. Some also say it was because Franco, when he was a young man, was rejected by two lodges. Others claim it was because he hated an older brother who was a prominent Mason. In any case, the General's anti-Masonic fervor didn't survive him; in 1979, the High Court of Spain restored freedom of association as a constitutional right.

Today, the Grand Lodge of Spain in Madrid oversees 180 traditional lodges throughout the country. In addition, the Symbolic Grand Lodge in Barcelona and the Spanish Federation of Le Droit Humain supervise several lodges which initiate both men and women on equal terms. Δ
